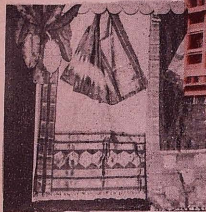

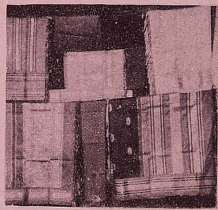
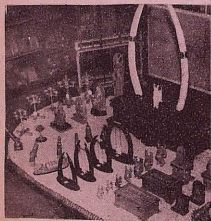

“ I, who had not been favoured with the opportunity of speaking to you for the past few days, have come now to avail myself of this opportunity to speak out what I must, and I do it with immense pleasure. When I decided to participate in this festive function I was prevented by doctors who said ‘ You should not address the meeting, and if so your body will be much affected’. My friends too tried to dissuade me. I told them that if my body would be affected due to my participation in this function that useless body need not exist, and I requested my friends and doctors to help me fulfill my desire.”

This is what Anna, the maker of modern Tamil Nadu, spoke in the function arranged to celebrate the restoration of the original name of ‘ Tamil Nadu ’ to our state that was called by the British ‘ Madras State ’. This was the first public function in which Anna participated after he underwent a major operation.

‘ Tamil Nadu ’ is the symbol of our Anna’s victory in his political career. He devoted his life to rousing the people from their slumber to the pristine glory of Tamil and Tamil Nadu.

Anna fascinated all the sections of Tamil population by his pen and tongue. It is usually said that “ The Pen is mightier than the sword ”. Anna’s tongue was mightier than the pen itself. Of all the orators ever born and recorded and praised by history, Arignar Anna was the most powerful orator who hypnotised the audience and achieved commendable victory in the field of politics.

HOW WELL HE LOVED THE BAPTISM OF TAMIL NADU

Anna’s oratorical skill in English was as good as his in Tamil. The Members of the Rajya Sabha were taken aback and remained spell-bound when Anna spoke. It is an astonishing record in the history of the Parliament of India that the Upper House of the Parliament (Rajya Sabha) remained in session even after the scheduled time to hear Anna’s speech in English till he concluded.

Foreign scholars whose mother-tongue was English were taken aback by Anna’s oration in English and Dr. A E. Asher of Edinburgh University admitted his inability to either surpass or equal Anna.

Anna was not a man of mere words. His deeds speak his glory louder than his words. He dreamt of Madras state being called by her original name in

sweet Tamil. He realised it in his life time. It was he who christened from the Floor of the Legislative Assembly and renamed the Madras State as Tamil Nadu. The whole Assembly seconded and echoed his voice unanimously.

Another of Anna’s aim was the legalisation of the Self-Respect Marriages. All along in his life Anna had been carrying the torch of Social Reform with Periyar E. V. Ramasamy, the greatest iconoclast of the twentieth century, as his leader. Anna wanted to establish a casteless society free from the evils of communal and religious clashes. His rationalist spirit succeeded in making the people of Tamil Nadu recognise Self-Respect Marriages through a legislation.

If ever any Government encouraged the establishment of a casteless society, it was Anna’s Government that encouraged Inter-Caste Marriages with Government Awards.

Anna was a friend, philosopher and guide of the depressed and down trodden people. Peasants and labourers, the literate and the illiterate, the whole populace including the artistes loved him dearly. He endeared himself to all. His birthday that falls on the 15th of September, is spectacularly celebrated throughout Tamil Nadu. It is not only the birthday of Anna, it is the birthday of Tamil Nadu itself. But for Anna ‘ Tamil Nadu ’ would not have come into being. It is no exaggeration to say that ‘ Tamil Nadu ’ was born when Anna was born.

SOCIO- ECONOMIC MEASURES TO COUNTERACT NAXALITE MENACE

The Conference of District Collectors and Superintendents of Police was inaugurated by the Tamil Nadu Governor, Thiru K. K. Shah at Rajaji Hall on 13th September 1971. The Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Dr. Kalamandalam Karunanidhi presided. The Chief Minister and the Governor called for vigilance to curb the violent activities of the extremists that disturbed the peace in the State.

Congratulating the Chief Minister and the officials for identifying themselves with the aspirations of the people, the Governor said; "In a democracy, the voter is the master and I am glad that this concept has taken root in Tamil Nadu".

The Governor said that Tamil Nadu is blessed with a stable and progressive administration and dynamic leadership.

The Chief Minister in his presidential address spoke as follows :

"The Naxalites are operating clandestinely to disrupt the peaceful atmosphere in the State,

though they are not as active as in some other States. I hope the Naxalite influence can be counteracted by the implementation of Socio-economic programmes by the Government. However, the police officials must keep a watch on Naxalite leaders.

I assure you, the collectors and Police Officials, that the Government will render you all help in discharging your duties efficiently. You must deal with the Naxalites firmly without caring for any political party.

It is unfortunate that some political parties have been encouraging Naxalites though all parties had demanded stern action against them. It is doubtful whether the Naxalites are really dedicated to the cause of the poor, as they profess to be. That persons from some aristocratic families are involved in the movement shows that they are building up a paradise of their own, their pastime being violence.

The Naxalites, like the Hippies lead a 'carefree life'. To the Naxalites violence seems to be a pleasure or Hobby.

The Socio-economic programmes must be implemented in the proper spirit. The Manu Needhi Thittam (Mass-contact programme) should be implemented more actively. The Collectors must find out whether the districts have the administrative set up necessary for such implementation and what changes should be made in the scheme at block and taluk levels.

I want to know whether the rural employment programme is

working well and what steps should be taken to widen its scope.

Some persons are carrying on a false propaganda by highlighting even normal offences as if they were the off-shoot of the dry law suspension. The Police must take prompt action against those who create trouble in public places under the influence of drink.

The youth corps enrolling 2,000 educated young men and women as members for service in villages will be inaugurated on 15th September. Those who come to join the corps should consider service to people as their main business, and not earning money.

The Government will issue instructions on the details of the scheme to give an aid of Rs. 1,000 each to unemployed technicians in the State for setting up their own workshops or service-centres. The Government wants every village in the State to get protected water supply as early as possible. The conference should discuss ways of achieving this.

Unless there is a re-orientation in the administration so as to have the interests of the people at heart, there will be no real progress.

CLEAR MANDATES GIVEN TO COLLECTORS

The Passing of the Self-Respect Marriages Act

It is realisation of our anxious dreams
for years together . . . ANNA

The self-respect Marriages Act was passed by the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly unanimously on 18th July 1967. Throwing light on the implications of the bill, Anna, as Chief Minister spoke as follows :

"Many of those who had opposed self-respect Marriages on many previous occasions have shed their misgivings and fears now. Dr. Hande asks: "You are always knocking down only the Hindus. Is the Hindu the only religious being whom you should attack?"

To bring about a change of mind among the Muslims they themselves can work, and that would be more appreciable. If my memory is correct, I would quote Vivekananda who has said that a true Hindu should not be afraid of changes and modifications, but should be able to admit fresh currents. A true Hindu would not admit of castes it is said. Therefore, Dr. Hande need not have any fear mistaking the Head of the subject (Hindu Marriages Act) under which the bill has been introduced.

A change in the mode of matrimonial ceremonies has been there in force for the past 35 years. This change was introduced facing many an opposition, abuse, ridicule and trouble from the public that misunderstood and feared this change. Thousands of marriages have taken place on these lines, and a new generation is coming into being.

Customs observed by people for a long time are usually given legal recognition later. *Custom by usage becomes law; custom by usage gets legal sanction.* Likewise we are granting a legal sanction to a custom prevailing in the society for about 30 or 40 years, and it is nothing more. After this Act is passed, it will not compel all people to observe only the procedure of self-respect marriages. It is not to order the people to follow this line of matrimonial functions. To put it in the words of lawyers, "it is a permissive legislation". A marriage can be conducted in this way also and this also is legal. This Act does not take away the right of the

people to have their marriages conducted according to their own established customs. If it is a preventive law, then it must be sent for public opinion. As it is not preventing others from having their own ways of conducting marriages and as it is only permitting those willing to have self-respect marriages, I believe it is enough if enlightened people like Ponnappa Nadar, M.L.A. (opposition) are informed and satisfied (with the need for this Legislation). Thiru Ponnappa Nadar must be a member of the Select Committee and must exercise his talents to make this legislation more effective and useful. He has the right, opportunity and ability to do it.

As far as my friends and I are concerned, we do not consider this legislation an easy joke. It is the realisation of our dream dreamt with anxiety for years together, and if you all respect our ideals it would be a consolation and good news to thousands of people who were married with the ideal of self-respect. Let these self-respecting individuals hear the glad tidings of their marriages being legalised. Please give your unstinted support to this. Do not please stand in the way of their pleasure. We must give self-respectors legal protection.

Many members expressed their views on the self-respect marriages. Thiru Arangannal said that this system of marriage is above party politics. I heard that Thiru Kamaraj attended a marriage last week in Virudhunagar. That marriage would not

have been conducted in the orthodox method. In Virudhunagar, Sathur and Sivakasi it has been customary to conduct marriages in the presence and presidency of some elders of the clan. Thiru Ponnappa Nadar coming from Kanyakumari district that was part of Kerala is aware of the modern changes in the orthodox systems of marriages prevalent earlier. In Bengal the Brhma Samaj has effected some changes in the matrimonial system. In Tamil Nadu the members of the self-respect movement, the Great Tamil Scholars and Savants like Thiru V. Kalyanasundaram and Maraimalai Adigal had admitted that self-respect marriage is harmless and in consonance with the change of Time and Tamil culture. It is usual, in parliamentary system, for the opposition to suggest amendments and it is also parliamentary procedure to withdraw such proposals of amendment. I was the Opposition to keep up the parliamentary system by withdrawing their proposed amendments. With a request that Thiru Ponnappa Nadar must withdraw his proposal for amendment, co-operate to make this law effective and share the pride of having helped pass this useful law, I conclude my speech. *Thiru R. Ponnappa Nadar*: In view of the assurance given by the Hon. Chief Minister, I am not pressing my amendment.

ANNA IN THE EYES OF OTHERS.

(DR. SUSHLA NAYAR).

Anna was little known outside his own State before he became the Chief Minister of Madras. I met him for the first time when he was elected to the third Lok Sabha. Soon after he came to Delhi, I met him at a dinner and it was a joy to talk with him. He had a keen sense of humour and his laughter was heart-warming. With all his greatness he had a strange humility and a captivating simplicity and frankness. It was an interesting eye-opener for me to hear him say that he had been agreeably surprised to experience such warmth, friendliness and hospitality in North India. It shows how little is the communication between different parts of India. It was of course an agreeable surprise for us to find the famous leader of D.M.K. to be a quiet, pleasant, humane person

who was full of wit and wisdom. There was nothing frightening or formidable about him. He was a deeply learned man and once he saw for himself that North Indians were like the people in South India, with similar feelings and similar reactions, it did not take him long to advise his party to give up their secessionist policies and accept the Constitution of India.

As a non-congress Chief Minister, he extended and received full co-operation to and from the Government of India and his loyalty to Tamil Nadu and Tamil culture and language did not interfere with his loyalty to the Union. Like the seers and sages of the past, he was able to see India's unity in diversity and realise that the difference of language, food habits and culture greatly contributed to the richness of the culture of India. India is poorer for the loss of a great and gifted son.

TAMIL NADU TO STEP INTO AN ERA OF MACHINERY EXPORT

Thiru S. Madhavan, after a 45 day Global tour has returned with the impression that Tamil Nadu has competence and competitive capacity to find markets abroad for the following lines of manufactures :—

(1) Internal combustion engines, including diesel engines, pump-sets and compressors. (2) Industrial machinery for the manufacture of sugar, paper, textiles, cement and chemicals, including accessories. (3) Asbestos Cement sheet manufacturing plants, (4) Cranes, hoists and lifts, (5) Mining and beneficiation plants for minerals, (6) Construction machinery, (7) Railway wagons, coaches, (8) Electrical transformers and (9) Telecommunication equipments and electronic instruments. He has returned with the conviction that there should be no more delay in the constitution of the proposed Export Promotion Wing in the Small Industries Development Corporation.

Tamil Nadu's exports in terms of value which stood at Rs. 6,756 lakhs in 1961-62 increased to Rs. 8,083 lakhs in 1965-66 and

to Rs. 15,644 lakhs in 1968-69. In 1969-70 exports touched the all time peak of Rs. 19,267 lakhs registering an increase of 23.2 per cent as compared to the previous year. Tamil Nadu's share in the total exports of the country was 18.7 per cent in 1969-70.

Tamil Nadu's exports are still dominated by traditional items such as vegetables, chillies, tanned leather, hides and skins, cotton yarn and thread, palm fibre, bidi wrapper leaves, and other vegetables and animal products, accounting for 60 per cent of the total exports. Bulk of the exports was from Madras Port, which accounted for 82.8 per cent of the total exports in 1969-70.

Malaysia was keen that Indian entrepreneurs should go there to establish new factories. At least five of the 17 Indian entrepreneurs now setting up factories in Malaysia were from Tamil Nadu. They included Mr. M. A. Chidambaram, Parrys, India Pistons, TI Cycles and Mr. M. Ct. Muthiah.

A major project, Thiru Madhavan discussed, was for production of paper from bagasse. Tamil Nadu with more than 19 sugar mills, most of them in the co-operative sector, could usefully go in for such a factory. The problem was "alternative fuel for the sugar factories and transport of the bulky sugarcane waste to the paper factory". A team from the Tokyo Engineering Corporation might visit Tamil Nadu to study the project in depth.

Other projects he discussed during his tour were: Gas cylinders production (with an

Italian firm), stainless steel blades (Mach Blade Co.), electronic components for internal and export markets (Mitsubishi and Toshiba), television sets and desalination plant.

Marubeni Ida would study utilisation of new iron ore deposits located near Tiruvannamalai.

Incidentally, Thiru Madhavan learnt from experts in Japan that the Salem ore and ore deposits in Tiruvannamalai area could be used for production of all kinds of steel, including conventional steel. This was contrary to the view of some people in India that the Salem ore was fit only for producing special steel.

Community Development Week.

The Government have directed that the Community Development Week should be celebrated throughout the State at the State, District and Block levels from 2nd to 8th October 1971. The Director of Rural Development, the Collectors and the Panchayat Union Commissioners will be responsible for

The Neyveli know-how.

Reliance on Soviet expertise in the running of the Neyveli Thermal Plant is now reduced to a single turbine-boiler specialist. In fact Neyveli-trained power technicians are now in demand in other parts of our country in the erection and commissioning of thermal power plants. They had been invited to help in the erection and commissioning of the Obra Power Plant in Uttar Pradesh.

Indian Staff at Neyveli have not only become familiar with Soviet know-how but some of them are also very much at home with the Russian language. Therefore, Mr. Sukhachov does not feel lonesome as "he can converse with his Indian colleagues in his own mother-tongue".

With the completion of erection and commissioning of all the nine units—six of 50 MW and three of 100 MW capacity each—the Soviet-aided Thermal Power Station at Neyveli has come to be the biggest lignite-based thermal power plant in the whole of South-East Asia. It is now all set to look for new horizons. There is every scope for its further expansion provided, of course, arrangements are made for regular supply of adequate quantities of lignite from a second mine-cut.

Mr. Sukhachov is the lone Soviet specialist at Neyveli just now. He has been assisting Indian specialists in the post-operation acid-cleaning of boiler No. 2.

This cleaning is very necessary because during operation, some sort of internal deposits are formed

inside boilers. They act as insulators and obstruct functioning of boilers. Mr. Sukhachov is initiating the Indian technicians into the intricacies of this cleaning process. The cleaning of the other boilers would be done entirely by Indians.

What has he to say about the performance of the Plant? He has all praise. To support his contention, he drew my attention to the reports of the Neyveli Lignite Corporation's Chairman Mr. Gopal Kumaramangalam and to press comments in leading news-papers in the South. The performance has been faultless.

Mr. Sukhachov feels that the power plant can earn for itself and also for the Corporation if at least it is run to produce a minimum 500 million units yearly.

Mr. Sukhachov is all appreciation for the skill of the Neyveli technicians. The huge power plant now is manned entirely by the Indian staff and they are even capable of taking up erection and commissioning work independently at other places also. "I met

some six of them at the Obra Power Station in Uttar Pradesh, where I was working before. They had been invited to help in the erection and commissioning of the power plant there. They have given very good account of themselves. That should tell you of the high standard of training given at Neyveli" he said.

Mr. Sukhachov, 35, is a graduate of the Moscow Institute of Energetics and has worked as a Turbine-Boiler Specialist in many power stations in and around Moscow. India is the first country he is visiting outside his own.

About the feasibility of the second mine-cut at Neyveli, the Managing Director says—

"Detailed investigation carried out by the Corporation has established the feasibility of opening a second mine-cut. There is a sound case for establishing a 600 MW thermal station (to be subsequently expanded to 1,000 MW) based on lignite to be excavated out of a second mine cut envisaging production of 7.1 million tonnes of lignite per annum. A tentative rough estimates for the second mine-cut and the 600 MW thermal station indicates that the cost of generation with the necessary profit margin would be much less than a thermal station located in South India based on coal. No doubt the thickness of overburden to be excavated and the quantity of water to be pumped per tonne of lignite would be more than in the first mine. But this could be successfully tackled, no major technical difficulties are anticipated. A major portion of the equipment necessary for the second mine and the 200 MW generation sets can be fabricated indigenously."

THE FACE LIFT FOR WOOD CARVINGS

Wood has been used by man for various purposes since palaeolithic times. He has done almost everything with it—made his home; made fire; made utensils, weapons and implements; built ships and bridges; made vehicles, furniture, art objects and musical instruments.

Exquisite carvings are to be found even today on temple cars and doors of ancient temples. Some are to be found at Thirumalai Naik Mahal at Madurai and the temples of Kerala. The oldest specimens of wood carvings are about 300 to 400 years old in this part of the country.

As man has been using wood for various purposes from early times, wood forms a large part of the collections in Museums and art houses. Its conservation has therefore, become a very important part in Museum technique. Various special methods have been evolved

for treating wood which help preserve valuable wood carvings.

The Government Museum, Madras has rich collections of wood carvings which are the best ones in our country. Every year large numbers of them are acquired and added to the reserve collection. Wood carvings so acquired in the Government Museum,



Madras are generally covered with tarry matter. This is due to the coating of tar applied on it by the villagers in order to protect it from being attacked by insects and fungi. This not only blackens the surface but also hides the artistic details of the carving. To remove the tarry matter, it has first to be softened. This is done either by pouring 5 per cent warm sodium carbonate solution over the carving or by immersing it in that solution for an hour. When the tarry matter becomes soft it is removed by scraping it off taking great care not to scratch the surface of the carving. The wood carving is then dried slowly. After drying it is given a preservative coating either with molten paraffin wax of 2 per cent 'ascu' solution.

Wood carvings deteriorate due to the attack of fungi, spread of infection, insect damage and contamination with salts.

In certain cases, the wood appears very spongy so much so

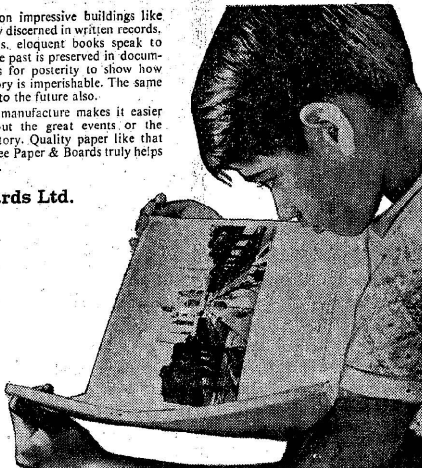

that even with a little pressure with the fingers, depressions are caused on the surface. In some, there are network of cracks running parallel to and across the grains due to which the wood has a tendency to shrink and warp. These are due to dry rot brought about by certain fungi. To destroy the fungi 3 to 6 ounces of commercial sodium fluoride or magnesium silico-fluoride is dissolved in one gallon of water and applied to the wood as a fungicide.

If there are borings and tunnels through which wood dust comes out, it can be gathered that the agents causing such decay are insects and their larvae. Insects, beetle and larvae in wood are killed either by heat treatment at about 130°F for about six hours or by vacuum treatment or by poisoning with gas (fumigation) or by spraying or by impregnating with liquid insecticides.

Fumigation is done in closed chambers using insecticides such as hydrocyanic acid, methyl bromide, ethylene oxide, carbon disulphide alone or with a mixture of carbon tetrachloride and ethylene dichloride for a number of days.

When there are incrustations and crystalline deposits on the surface which become powdery, then it is presumed that soluble salts are playing their part. Soluble salts which are generally found responsible for deterioration are the chlorides and sulphates of sodium, calcium and magnesium. In order to remove the salts, wet paper pulp is applied on the wood

carving until it is completely concealed with the pulp. The wood carving absorbs water from the paper pulp due to which the salts in the wood get dissolved. When the pulp dries the dissolved salts in the wood are drawn and deposited on the paper pulp forming an incrustation. The pulp is left in position for about three weeks. The dry pulp is then removed, washed from the absorbed salts and applied again if necessary. The thickness of the pulp layer to be applied depends upon the amount of salts on the object. After the salts are removed the wood is dried slowly first with alcohol and then between sheets of dry blotting papers.

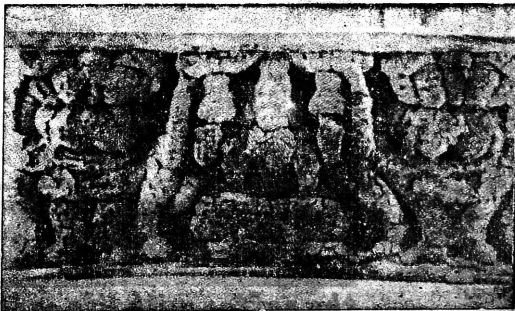
When woodwork has been severely weakened as a result of insect attack or fungal decay, it may be necessary to adopt procedures designated to restore mechanical strength to the wood. This consolidation can be readily achieved

by impregnating the weakened woodwork with a synthetic resin such as 5 per cent solution of vinyl acetate or 0.5 per cent methyl methacrylate.

Small cracks are filled by using acrylic modelling paste (Liquitex) and long tunnels are filled with wooden putty to which an insecticide has been added. In order to make the fillers match with the colour of the wood, suitable powdered pigment or acrylic paint is added to it.

The conservation laboratory in the Madras Government Museum was established in the year 1930 for the care and conservation of the vast collections in the Museum. It is the foremost in the field of Museum conservation in this country. The conservation laboratory amongst other tasks, deals with the preservation and restoration of wood carvings.

This decayed wood carving was restored to its original form as seen in picture printed on p-11.

RICE CULTIVATION IN DRY AREAS

SPECIAL PRACTICES EVOLVED

The Central Rice Research Institute, Cuttack has succeeded in evolving cultural practices capable of growing paddy with half the water now used. These practices will help growing of rice in the semi-dry regions with only 900 to 1,000 mm. rainfall per year. Apart from Bala, the rice variety now in use in these upland tracts, the work in progress at the Institute will bring out more strains suitable for these areas.

According to the findings of the Institute, the time of harvest of a variety has a direct bearing on its milling and head rice recovery. The crop should be harvested at 20 to 25 per cent moisture level and dried uniformly in shade to about 12 to 14 per cent for a high head rice recovery. The total power available in rice culture is very low, involving hundreds of man-hours and bullock power per hectare in a crop season. Lack of sufficient power results in late transplanting and harvest. Consequently the yield suffers. There is therefore considerable scope for partial mechanisation in rice culture during land preparation and harvest. Scope exists for the development of simple implements for weeding, application of fertiliser, etc. The Institute has developed a simple two-row seed drill for sowing dry

seeds in upland soils or germinated seeds in puddled soils. The fertiliser drill developed at the Institute helps in the proper placement of fertiliser in puddled soils, thereby increasing the efficacy of the applied nitrogenous fertiliser.

From the Institute there is a continuous flow of valuable research information to research personnel elsewhere and also to the farmers in the field. There are more than 100 rice research stations spread over the country and the Institute runs national Training Courses of six months duration for their staff. It has also organised international training courses for rice technicians from South East Asian countries, France, Egypt, etc. Through national demonstrations the message of improved agronomical practices has been carried to the cultivator in the field.

Since 1968, emphasis has been on crop diversification to produce maximum yield per unit area per unit time. By introducing an intermediate crop such as potato, ragi and groundnut in between two rice crops and having jute as one of the crops succeeded by two crops of rice, a minimum net profit of Rs. 5,000 and a maximum

of Rs. 14,000 per year have been obtained by the cultivators in the Institute's demonstration plots, using the latest production techniques. An average yield of not less than 11 tonnes of rice per hectare during two crop seasons has been produced in the demonstration units.

On September 16 the Central Rice Research Institute, Cuttack, will start the celebrations of its Silver Jubilee Week. During the two and a half decades of its existence, the Institute has made a varied contribution to the increased production of a crop which occupies a top position in India's agricultural economy.

Rice, the most important crop of India, is cultivated over 39.4 million hectares. The 1970-71 production of rice was 42.45 million tonnes, the value of which would be approximately Rs. 4,250 crores. Rice production, milling and distribution engage the highest percentage of people in India. It will continue to dominate Indian agricultural economy for many years to come. Therefore, rice research plays a leading role in national development.

The Central Rice Research Institute was established in 1946 and was transferred to the Indian Council of Agricultural Research in 1966. It has built up 5,000 collections of rice germ plasm which are supplied to other agencies on request. The Institute is also enrolled as a Centre of the FAO for maintenance of the world genetic stock of rice.

WORLD RECOGNITION FOR INDIA'S ARCHITECT OF GREEN REVOLUTION

*Award for Dr. M. S. Swaminathan
for Community Leadership.*

Dr. Moncompu Sambasiva Swaminathan, Director of Indian Agricultural Research Institute, has been elected to receive the 1971 Ramon Magsaysay Award for Community Leadership.

Dr. Swaminathan has made rich contribution to the green revolution experienced in India in the last three years. For the past 16 years he had made major advances in breeding sturdier,

more productive, and better quality plant types at the IARI. By purposeful manipulation of genes, he and his co-workers recently developed a dwarf, non-lodging wheat variety, 'Sharbati Sonora', with amber grains containing 16.5 per cent protein and three per cent lysine. The importance of this need hardly be stressed in the Indian diet with very poor protein content.

The Wheat Wizard.

The eminent Nobel Prize winner Dr. Norman Borlaug had worked closely with Dr. Swaminathan which ultimately helped in the spread of the exotic and dwarf varieties of wheat which shot up production in the States of Punjab, Haryana and U.P. among others. Dr. Swaminathan has a rare virtue of a brilliant scientist with immense capacity to transfer his knowledge to others in the library, class room and fields and through prolific writings. After he took charge as a Director of IARI, he has also revitalised it and earned it the reknown of the Institution whose findings have attracted world wide attention.

Success in Applied Research.

Quite often there is criticism that many of our research institutions spend much of their times and resources on research work lacking application to industry or agriculture. IARI is among the few institutions which provides a refreshing contrast. It has made tremendous contribution to the spread of modern agricultural practices which in turn contributed to self-sufficiency in foodgrains.

The willingness of the average Indian farmer to adapt himself to new techniques shedding centuries of conservatism is largely due to the willingness of many of our scientists to move with the farmer and study his problems at close quarters. The number of package programmes and the work of numerous agricultural research institutions have spread modern agricultural practices far and wide, largely because of these scientists. Dr. Swaminathan is known for his making any number of trips to villages around Delhi offering invaluable advice to the individual farmers.

A Village of Seed Multipliers!

As part of a High-Yielding Varieties Programme designed by Dr. Swaminathan, one community near Delhi was transformed into a "seed village" specializing in controlled multiplication of improved varieties to supply the needs of the entire union territory of Delhi.

The Ramon Magsaysay Award Foundation states: "This combination of talents has made Dr. Swaminathan an acknowledged leader of India's community of agriculturalists. Now 45 years of age, he is carrying forward his Madras family tradition of energetic personal emphasis upon professional excellence. That he is doing so with such broadly beneficial results for rural India is the mark of a first-rate scientist who also has become an effective humanist."

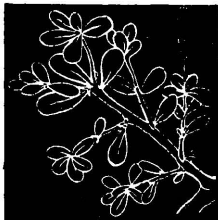

OUT-PATIENTS RECOVER SOONER THAN IN-PATIENTS

Some Interesting Facts.

The Government Mental Hospital celebrated its Centenary in a fitting manner, with the President of India gracing the occasion. A special report prepared for the occasion gave the following interesting facts :—

The in-patients take longer to recover than the out-patients as the out-patients have the additional therapeutic value of the love and care of their near and dear relatives. The average period of treatment for in-patients is 3 months and 3 days while out-patients on an average recover after a treatment of one month and 27 days. The over-all recovery rate for the patients was reported as 56 per cent. The hospital is however up against a curious phenomenon, viz., that relatives responsible for the patient, fail to be convinced about the recovery and doubt whether the recovered patient will remain normal at home. This results in undue accumulation of the patients in the hospital, encouraging their chronicity that could have been avoided with better co-operation from society.

The hospital does not wash its hands of the recovered and discharged patients. The follow-up treatment is very significant in the case of persons who have recovered from mental disorders:

Hence the hospital feels that the time has come when the psychiatric services should be made available in all district headquarters hospitals, so that discharged patients can easily avail themselves of drugs and psychiatric help nearer their homes. This way relapses could be avoided.—

On the occasion of its centenary celebration the hospital expressed the following as its immediate needs.

1. Rehabilitation facilities for the mentally handicapped by way of engaging them in sheltered work shops, thus helping them to learn a trade and also earn a living, when this is fully established we intend to start "Half Way Home" where these individuals could find their place in the community outside.

2. A psychiatric out-patient service with 20 to 30 in-patient beds in every district headquarters hospital. These should be equipped with mobile units to take this service to primary health centre and Taluk Hospitals.

3. An institution for admitting, investigating, managing and rehabilitating the mentally retarded.

4. Starting of a Post-Graduate diploma or degree course in this

institution so as to train sufficient personnel to staff and manage the various new services that are likely to be started soon.

In general, the hospital was in a position to declare that admissions are much less than what it used to be some ten years ago because of better out-patient service and as a corollary the lesser number of in-patients are able to avail better treatment due to more intense care resulting from better staff-patient ratio. The following treatment facilities are resorted to in the hospital for both in-patients and out-patients, apart from the modern drugs—

(1) Physical methods :—

Electro-convulsive therapy
Psychosurgery—Now performed at Government General Hospital, Madras will soon be undertaken here.

(2) Psychological methods.

(3) Recreation methods.

(4) Occupation Methods.

(5) Ergo Therapy (Work Therapy).

The Mental Hospital is running a sort of Day-hospital for the benefit of local patients and patients who have local relations. In the Day-hospital excited, violent and unmanageable patients are admitted. All the investigations and diagnostic tests (i.e. Radiological, biochemical and Psychological) and all forms of treatment that are available to the in-patient inside the mental hospital are made available to these day-hospital patients.

MORE COFFEE PLANTATION AREAS FOR TAMIL NADU

The Coffee Board has at the request of State Government surveyed the hill ranges of Dhankanikottai Taluk in Tamil Nadu and submitted a technical report on the suitability of the ranges for coffee cultivation. Coffee Board has also offered technical comments at the request of State Government on the feasibility of starting coffee plantations in Kolli hills in Tamil Nadu. Technical officers of the Board are also participating in the implementation of the State Government's scheme for development of coffee plantations in Yercaud Hills in Tamil Nadu. The Coffee Board is also operating the following schemes for development of coffee plantations in the country including Tamil Nadu: Scheme for grant of long-term loans for intensive cultivation of small registered coffee holdings, scheme for grant of long-term loans for replanting, open to all registered estates, scheme for grant of short-term loans for yearly working capital, open to estates not exceeding 100 acres in extent and scheme for supply of equipment and machinery on hire purchase terms, open to all registered estates.

PROPERTY TAX ON CENTRAL GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS TOO

Legislation, authorising local bodies to levy taxes on Central Government property, is proposed to be introduced in the next session of Parliament.

This meets a long-standing demand of civic administrations, particularly in metropolitan cities and State capitals.

The Government's plans for legislation were conveyed by the Health and Family Planning Minister, Mr. Uma Shankar Dikshit, to a joint meeting of the Central Council of Local Self-Government and the executive committee of the All-India Council of Mayors.

STATE-WIDE CELEBRATION ON COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT WORKS

The Government have directed that the Community Development Week should be celebrated throughout the State at the State, district and block levels from 2nd to 8th October 1971. The Director of Rural Development, the Collectors and the Panchayat Union Commissioners will be responsible for the celebrations at the State, district and block levels respectively.

The programme during the Community Development Week are to be so arranged as to accommodate all the possible aspects of the Community Development Programme highlighting among them prize distribution such as best gramasevaks, gramasevikas at block and district levels, etc., benefit performances, exhibitions, seminars, public meetings centring around the role played by the Community Development Programme in the betterment of the community at the various levels.

During the celebration, special emphasis is to be laid on the new role of the Community Development Programme in the context of the forces released by the Green Revolution. In relevant fields, the International Agencies like the FAO, UNICEF, UNDP and ILO are also expected to participate.

Presently a ship nears the shore and Kannagi's face lights-up with joy. The ship is anchored and alighting into small boats, the passengers travel towards the shore. There are Greeks and Romans among them. In one of the boats is a strong young man, with soulful eyes and next to him is an elderly Greek gentleman. The young man is Kovalan, Kannagi's husband. On spotting his boat, Kannagi wades through the shallow waters to reach it quicker.

GREEK GENTLEMAN (to Kovalan) : I wonder who is that angel of a girl? Her courage matches her good looks, for see, how she defies the waves.

KOVALAN (in excitement) : She is my wife Kannagi.

GREEK GENTLEMAN : I envy you, my boy. In my motherland Greece, there is not a woman comparable to the divine beauty who

THE STORY OF THE ANKLET.

Senguttuvan and Ilango were the sons of King Neduncheralathan. One day an astrologer appeared in the King's court and prophesied that only Ilango, the younger son, would ascend the throne, and not the rightful elder son Senguttuvan according to his astrological calculations. The younger prince, Ilango challenged the astrologer and promised to belie his forecast and renounced the royal life itself. He became a monk leaving to his elder brother the right of succeeding to the throne. It was this monk Ilango who devoted himself to writing the immortal epic Silappa thikaram in poetic form. The earlier part of this drama deals with the renunciation of Prince Ilango before he became the author of the Story of the Anklet. This shows the righteous attitude of Ilango and his respect for elders.

Smiling in pride, Kovalan leaps into the sea and swims to meet Kannagi. They embrace each other and even the waves seem to rejoice at their union.

KOVALAN (in emotion) : Kannagi!

KANNAGI (sulking) : How long had you conspired, my Lord, to leave me alone and be happy elsewhere?

KOVALAN (caressing her as they walk on the damp sand) : If agony could be called happiness, I was indeed happy, Kannagi. Remember that the sword of separation is sharp-edged on both sides.

By now the two have reached dry sand. They stand in the steady sea-breeze as Kovalan takes out a small casket from the folds of his dress and gives it to Kannagi.

KOVALAN : This is from Greece and it is my special present to you.

Kannagi opens the casket and sees an exquisite piece of carved ivory.

(KANNAGI (enraptured) : Ivory exported from Taminad has come to life under the hands of Greek craftsmen.

KOVALAN : Materials from Taminad are much in demand there, Kannagi. Peacock-feathers are made into the costumes of danseuses.

found that possession of pearls from Tamilnad is considered an index of one's wealth and standing in business-circles.

KANNAGI : What a rich tribute to our land.

KOVALAN : But one thing they have not realised yet, that there in Tamilnad is a treasure which is far more precious than all the ivory and pearls and rubies.....

KANNAGI (*eager*) : What is there, my Lord, so very precious?

KOVALAN (*softly*) : It is my Kannagi whose image is imprinted on my heart. Whenever I am in alien land, I think of Tamilnad as the birthplace of Kannagi and every time I chant her name, poetry wells up in me.

KANNAGI (*proud and shy*) : My Lord, will you ever leave me again ?

KOVALAN : Is it ever possible to be away from Tamil ?

KANNAGI (*keeping up the metaphor*) : In case an alien language intervenes ?

KOVALAN : It will be swept away. Like light to the eyes and timbre to the harp and like the moon to the skies, shall I be with you for ever and aye.

KANNAGI : Not like the moon, my Lord, for it plays truant. Don't you know it is pitch-dark on the night of the new moon ?

KOVALAN : Kannagi, even if I forget myself I shall not forget your face of perfect beauty and grace which is the acme of the artist's dream. Let us go home now and make up for all the days of separation.

The elderly Greek Gentleman walks up to them.

GREEK GENTLEMAN : Kovalan, I don't blame you for forgetting an old man like me !

KOVALAN : Pardon me, Sir. (*Introducing him to Kannagi*) Kannagi, he is a prominent merchant from Greece. (*She curtsies*). The bulk of our exports pass only through his firm. (*Humorously*). All that is grey is not old, Kannagi and our friend here has the heart of youth.

GREEK GENTLEMAN (*in mock anger*) : How dare you call me old, Kovalan ? Let me

appeal to the comely judge here, tell, damsel, am I an old man ?

KANNAGI (*prankish*) : Not at all, thatha !

GREEK GENTLEMAN : That is right, bright girl ! Kovalan, what does 'thatha' mean in your language ?

KOVALAN : It is the equivalent of Apollō in Greek, Sir !

GREEK GENTLEMAN (*delighted*) : See ! She is as wise as she is beautiful.

KOVALAN (*explaining*) : Kannagi, he is learning Tamil only from me.

KANNAGI : So, he would have by now learnt two of the three sections in Tamil language, prose and melody.

GREEK GENTLEMAN : But the theatre art of Tamilnad is still a sealed book to me.

KANNAGI (*to Kovalan*) : My Lord, today Madhavi is giving a dance programme in the Hall of Pearls. Why not we take our friend there to witness the performance ?

Kovalan agrees and he and Kannagi go home accompanied by the guest.

QUEEN OF ARTISTES.

Auditorium of Pearls, Madhavi's dance is in progress. The Chola King and his family are in the front rows of the audience. Near the entrance to the dais and down below are seated Madhavi's mother Chitrapathi, her agent, a very old hunchbacked woman and Madhavi's companion and maid Vasantamalai.

Kovalan, Kannagi and the Greek Gentleman enter the hall and take their seats.

Madhavi's artistry keeps the audience spell-bound. The Greek visitor, in particular, is overwhelmed.

GREEK GENTLEMAN : Kovalan, is it a portrait come alive that is dancing there ?

KOVALAN (*ragging him*) : It must be so, for nothing else could rekindle the embers in your ancient heart. The portrait is Madhavi and I myself have known her only through reputation, till this evening.

The programme concludes, to the applause of the audience. Madhavi comes from the dais and bows before the King.

KING : My blessings to you, Madhavi. In the field of dancing you are the foremost in our land. May your genius flourish !

Saying which, he presents her a flower-garland, a baton (as mark of her supremacy in Fine Arts) and a silk-purse containing 1,008 kazhanjus of gold. He then leaves the hall, with his retinue.

Chitrapathi whispers something in the ears of the hunch-backed old woman. Hunchback takes the garland from Madhavi's hand and goes to the dais.

HUNCHBACK (to the audience) : Gentlemen, Chitrapathi's daughter Madhavi provided a feast to your eyes and ears and heart so far and now, we shall move a stage ahead. Here is an opportunity for any one eligible in your midst to seek her hand (*holding up the garland*). He who is able to pay 1,008 kazhanjus of gold for this flower-garland shall be Madhavi's life-companion.

The magnitude of the price stuns the audience.

GREEK GENTLEMAN (rushing towards the dais) : Here is the gold.

Chitrapathi and Hunchback exchange glances of delight.

MADHAVI (alarmed) : Vasantamalai !

VASANTAMALAI (hurrying close to Madhavi, in a gesture of defence) : Madhavi !

The Greek Gentleman unties a bag and pours out the gold for all to see.

GREEK GENTLEMAN : This gold I had brought to buy pearls from Tamilnad but now I have got something more valuable. This is not the price of the garland but of Madhavi; the queen of my heart. (*To Hunchback*) Here take the gold and give me the garland.

As Hunchback is about to conclude the transaction, Madhavi grabs the garland from her hand and rushes sobbing to her mother, Chitrapathi.

CHITRAPATHI (chiding her daughter) : What is all this, Madhavi ? Are you still a child ? Give the garland at once.

VASANTAMALAI (to Chitrapathi) : Madam for the sake of 1,008 kazhanjus of gold, do you want to throw away your daughter on this 108-year-old bidder ? (*pleading*) Listen to me, Madam, and postpone the selection to a more opportune occasion.

CHITRAPATHI : Hush, Vasantamalai, it shall not be said that Chitrapathi went back on her word. Madhavi belongs to this Gentleman and I will not be challenged on this.

VASANTAMALAI (wringing her hands and appealing to the audience) : Is there no one here to come to the rescue of Madhavi ? (*Getting no response, she turns to the Greek*



Gentleman himself) Sir, I appeal to your good sense ; Oh; do please save Madhavi:!

GREEK GENTLEMAN (*in mordant wit*): I will for the rest of her life and mine. I have sufficient riches for the purpose.

Kovalan and Kannagi stand rooted to the spot, not knowing what to do, to help Madavi

CHITRAPATHI (*grim*): Madhavi, give the garland. Did you not say that you would marry and settle down in life ? And now that I have yielded to your whim and arranged the match, why do you want to humiliate me like this ?

MADHAVI (*in a tear-choked voice*) ; I have decided to remain a virgin.

CHITRAPATHI (*her anger mounting*) I can not dance to your tunes all the time (*Meancingly*) Give the garland or else.

KANNAGI (*to Kovalan*) : My Lord, I cannot bear to see Madhavi's plight. Please do something to rescue her from a sentence worse than death.

MADHAVI (*losing all hope and falling at the feet of the Greek Gentleman*) : Sir, have pity on me !

GREEK GENTLEMAN (*querulous*) : What is all this drama ? A promise was held out in public that whoever pays 1,008 kazhanjus of gold for the garland could claim Madhavi and now there seems to be conspiracy to back out of the deal.

Kovalan strides towards the dais.

KOVALAN (*firmly, to greek Gentleman*): Enough of this. You will get neither the garland nor Madhavi ; collect your gold and come out please.

GREEK GENTLEMAN : Kovalan, so you are also in the conspiracy. Wonderful are the standards of justice in Tamilnad !

KOVALAN (*pricked*) : It is not considered proper in Tamilnad that an old man should yearn for a young bride.

GREEK GENTLEMAN (*not budging*) : Then why was the offer made here in such specific terms ?

KOVALAN : Madhavi's mother stipulated the condition that whoever can afford to buy

the garland could claim her daughter. My interpretation and verdict is that he who bids for the garland should be worthy of Madhavi, Is that clear ? Let us go now ? you have caused enough anguish to everyone here.

GREEK GENTLEMAN (*adamant*) : Madhavi is mine and I shall not leave without her. You have an agile brain and a glib tongue, Kovalan, but all your oratory cannot cover the fact that no one here could compete with me and produce 1,008 kazhanjus of gold.

KOVALAN (*stung to the quick*) : Dare you imply that we are bankrupts here in Poompuhar ? (*unclasping the pearl necklace he is wearing*) Here is something worth a lot more than 1,008 kazhanjus of gold. I will take the garland in exchange for this and thereby rescue Madhavi from the clutches of this old sinner.

Impulsively he hands over his pearl-necklace to Madhavi and takes the garland from her hands. Kannagi in the audience is taken aback by the turn of events. His mission of rescuing Madhavi accomplished, Kovalan walks off the dais and comes straight to Kannagi.

KOVALAN : Kannagi, let us go.

KANNAGI (*apprehensive*) : But.

KOVALAN (*not noticing her fear*): Come on, dear, we have nothing else to do here. (*He hustles her and they leave the auditorium.*)

The hall is soon empty and the frustrated Greek too has left with the rest of the audience. Madhavi and her team are however still on the dais. Madhavi has recovered her poise:

MADHAVI : Vasantamalai, he took my garland but why has he gone away ?

VASANTAMALAI : That is an odd question, Madhavi. Why should he stay ?

CHITRAPATHI (*to Vasantamalai*) : Simpleton, don't you follow her train of thoughts. She wants to meet him again (*Turning to her daughter*) Am I not right, Madhavi ?

Madhavi blushes and averts her eyes in affirmation.

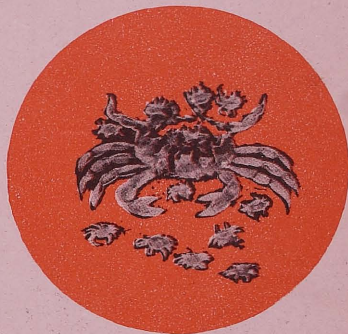
