Raw Film — Permits by Priorities

A Communication says:

The following system of priorities shall be observed by all the three Regional Committees on films in Madras, Bombay and Calcutta, in issuing release orders for day to day supplies of Raw Film for pictures under production, with effect from 5th September, 1958.

- 1. Pictures started before 7-6-'57 which had been in progress and are in advanced stage of production.
 - 2. Regular Producers:
- (a) Studio-owner producers who have been continuously producing pictures for three years immediately preceding 7-6-'57.
- (b) Producers who have produced three or more full length feature films in the three years preceding 7-6-'57,
- (c) Producers who have been continuously in production for three years preceding 7-6-'57 and who had completed 2 pictures during this period or had completed one picture and had another under production on 7-6-'57.

- (N. B. The above item viz. 2 (c) is the amendment to the original item as had been circulated by the Chamber previously.)
- 3. Producers who have past record of at least one picture censored between 1952 & 7-6-'57.
- 4. Producers without past record but who had started their picture before 7-6-'57.
- 5. Studio-owners without past record.
- 6. Producers without past record but who have started their pictures after 7-6-'57.
- 7. Partners and Directors of firms and companies who have past record but which are now inactive.
 - 8. Newcomers.
- 9. Special cases may be considered ex-gratia by the Central Committee on the recommendation of the Regional Committee.

The above list of priorities is not applicable to the allocation of positive for release prints which will be done in accordance with the existing practice in the order of priority of censor certificate numbers.

Metric System from To-day

The new system of weights and measures called the Metric System is introduced in India to-day, the 1st October, 1958.

To begin with, it is introduced in specified areas of all the States, in some Government Departments and in some industries, both public and private.

The system will be applicable in the beginning to the following:

Cotton textile mills, iron and steel factories engaged in the manufacture of heavy chemicals, cement, salt, paper, pulp or paper board, refractories, copper, aluminium, lead, antimony, tin etc. It will also be applicable to the Indian Airlines, Air India International and Coffee Board. The system has already been made applicable to the Jute industry from 1st July, 1958.

It is envisaged to introduce the Metric System gradually. A maximum period of 10 years from the passing of the Act in 1956 has been provided for its complete adoption. Even after the introduction of the new system, the use of the existing units shall be permitted for a period of two years i.e., till September 30, 1960,

The system is intended to do away with the prevailing confusion in the field of weights and measures and give a unified system which is essential for the smooth running of industry trade and commerce.

WHAT IS METRIC SYSTEM?

The Metric System derives its name from the Metre, which is the primary unit for measuring length. In this system as in all decimal systems, the basis of calculation is 10.

We multiply or divide any unit of length, weight or volume by the same number i.e. 10.

In the Metric System, the multiples of a unit have the prefix deca (10 times), hecta (10 × 10 = 100 times) and kilo (10 × 10 × 10 = 1000 times).

The sub-units have the prefix, deci (1/10), centi (1/100) and milli (1/1000).

UNITS

The primary unit of length is The Metre which is approximately equal to 40 inches while the yard is equal to 36 inches.

1 Metre = 40 inches approx. 1 Kilometre = 5 furlongs.

SUB-UNITS

10 Millimetres = 1 Centimetre.

10 Centimetres = 1 Decimetre

10 Decimetres = 1 Metre.

MULTIPLES

10 Metres = 1 Decametre.

10 Decametres = 1 Hectometre.

10 Hectometres = 1 Kilometre.

METRIC WEIGHTS FORM TO-DAY

The first phase of the change over is in weights. From to-day, the 1st October of 1958, the use of Metric weights comes to be introduced in selected areas of the States. The following table will give the Metric equivalents of the present weights.

Shows in Educational Institutions:

Ministry of Information and Broadcasting Order dated the 16th August 1958 says:

- G.S.R:—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 17 of the Cinematograph Act, 1952 (37 of 1952), the Central Government hereby exempts cinematograph exhibition of films in the premises of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territories of India from the operation of Section 10 of the said Act, subject to the following conditions namely:—
- 1. Only films of a predominantly educational nature, certified as such by the Central Board of Film Censors, or films approved as scientific films, films intended for educational purposes, films dealing with news and current events or documentary films approved by the Film Advisory Board shall be exhibited or permitted to be exhibited.
- 2. No admission fee, except to the extent required to cover expenses, shall be charged.
- 3. No person other than students and staff of the Institutions, members of the Managing Committees of the Institutions

and any guests specially invited by the authorities or the Institutions and those enumerated under condition (9) below shall be admitted to the show.

- 4. On ly non-inflammable films strips shall be exhibited or permitted to be exhibited.
- 5. The persons organising the exhibition of films shall be responsible for taking adequate safety measures against fire or any other mishap like the collapse of gallaries, roof etc., of the place where such films are exhibited.
- 6. No advertisement films shall be exhibited or permitted to be exhibited.
- 7. All Institutions which avail themselves of this exemption shall maintain a register of the films exhibited and comply with any other directions that may be issued in this behalf by the administrations concerned. The register shall be open to inspection by duly authorised officers of each Administration.
- 8. This exemption shall be valid for a period of one year with effect from the date of issue of this notification, unless revoked earlier.

9. Employees of the Administration, members of the Central Board of Film Censors and its Advisory Panels and Regional and Assistant Regional Officers of the Board engaged in the discharge of their official duties shall be admitted to the place where the exhibitions are held and to the film shows.

Madras Entertainments tax (Andhra Pradesh Extension and Amendment) Act. 1958— Date of Enforcement:

G.O. Ms. No. 15. 5, Revenue, August 1958. states---"Under Sub-section(3) of Section 1 of the Madras Entertainments Tax (Andhra Pradesh Extension and Amendment) Act, 1958 (Andhra Pradesh Act XII of 1958), the Governor of Andhra Pradesh hereby appoints the 1st day of October 1958, as date on which all the provisions of the said Act (except Section I which had already come into force), shall come into force."

Film Production Bureau:

A press note dated 24th Sep. 1958, states as follows:

Dr. B. V. Keskar, Minister for Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, in the course of his reply to Mr. Ram Sahai in the Rajya Sabha New Delhi on September 24th, 1958, informed that the proposed Film Production Bureau, will be constituted by the Government within the next two months.

He also informed the House that progress had been made towards the setting up of the Film Institute.

It may be mentioned here that the constitution of these two bodies is envisaged in the Film Enquiry Committee's Report.

Cinematographic Film—Export Promotion:

New Delhi, September, 1, As announced by Mr. K. B. Lall, Director-General of Foreign Trade, at the meeting here of the Export Promotion Advisory Council on Aug. 30, the Government of India have decided to allow import of some additional length of raw cinematographic films against the prints of Indian feature films exported by Indian film producers.

This step has been prompted presumably by the increasing popularity of Indian films in foreign countries and the widening market for them. They are becoming significant among the newer sources export earnings. The markets for Indian films until recently were the neighbouring countries where large Indian communities reside. While the demand from these is being maintained Indian Films are becoming popular with the audiences of Asia as well and in some European countries. The Union Ministry of Commerce and Industry has recently been advised by trade representative that Indian films shown in some European countries, including the U. K. and Germany were well received.

The biggest importer of Indian films at present is Ceylon, with

Singapore running a close second. In the first four months of 1958 Ceylon imported Rs. 9/lakhs worth of feature films (standard 35m.m.) and Singapore Rs. 6 lakhs worth. The third biggest importer was Fiji which took about Rs. 3 lakhs.

Legal

Industrial Dispute:

The Bombay High Court have given their decision in a petition filed against the verdict of the Industrial Tribunal—a report says.

The petitioners were employed in the Nishat Talkies, Poona,

The Receiver took possession of the property of the Talkies on 22nd February 1954. On October 1954. 11th Mr. Tata entered into an agreement with the Receiver for the supply of films for exhibition in this Cinema. On January 27, 1956 the Receiver was discharged and he served notices of discharge on the employees of the Nishat Talkies. On January 28, 1956, the lease was obtained by Mr. Tata, for 10 years beginning from 1st February 1956. On 31st January 1956, he issued letters of appointment to the employees of the Nishat Talkies. On May 7, 1956, a dispute had between the Nishat Talkies and its employees which was referred to the Industrial Tribunal and the Tribunal rejected the plea of the petitioners in regard to continuity of service.

Regarding identity of business, the Bombay High Court observed that what was required was that the same business which was carried on by the transferer must be carried on by the transferee. It was not sufficient

that a business was similar or of the same nature. The court further observed that the doctrine of sanctity of the contract governing the relations of employer and the employees was obsolete and that it was the duty of the Industrial Court or the Tribunal to modify the contractual rights and obligations if it became to do so in the light of the Industrial legislation and the legal decision relating thereto.

In the present case, Shri Tata had come on the scene only on February 1, 1956. All the post dues had been paid to employees. The Receiver had discharged the services of the employees by a notice dated 27th January 1956 and Shri Tata had re-appointed them by notice dated the 31st January 1956. There was a break of 4 days in the service of the workmen though it was admitted that the theatre was not closed between these days and the employees continued to serve.

In the light of the above mentioned two points the High Court observed that there was continuity of service and the first essential ingredient for purposes of determining whether the past services of the employees should be taken into account was therefore satisfied. The approach of the Tribunal to this question was wrong in law.



Trade Associations

The Cine Technicians Guild of South India:

At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Cine Technicians Guild of South India, held on Sunday the 14th September 1958 with Shri. Nimai Ghosh, presiding the following resolutions were passed:—

"Pursuant to the resolution passed at an earlier general meeting of the Cine Technicians Guild of South India held on 14th August 58, to hold a protest meeting against the cut on Raw film imports, this meeting of the Executive Committee ratifies the steps taken by the President of the Guild in contacting the several associations of the film industry so far and further resolves that a meeting of the Steering Committee be held on Sunday the 21st inst., at 9. A.M. at Revathi, Mount Road, Madras, for chalking out a plan in detail for the conduct of the public protest meeting."

"This meeting of the Executive Committee of the Cine Technicians Guild of South India after carefully going thro' the latest directives of the Central Government with regard to the day to day distribution of raw stock as per priority has come to the conclusion that the above directives instead of alleviating the present crisis will only aggravate the trouble by reducing the number of productions, thereby creating unemployment and misery among the Cine Labour."

South Indian Artistes' Association, Madras

The following resolution was passed:

Executive Committee This meeting of the South Indian Artistes' Association feels greatly over the grave situation created the Raw Film **Import** Control, to the South Indian Film Industry and unanimously resolves that the Government of India be requested to reconsider the decision regarding the Import Control of Raw Film and remove the restriction in full to avert the crises facing the thousands of Artistes Technicians and persons employed in the Film Industry in South India.


On Study Tour

Regional Seminar on Visual Aids in Fundamental Education and Community Development:

A press note says:

Thirteen Asian nations of cultures. different languages, school systems and social conditions have sent delegates to meet on common ground at a seminar on the use of visual aids in fundamental education and community development. seminar, the second of its kind to be held under the sponsorship of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and cultural Organisation (UNESCO) opened in New Delhi, India on the 8th September and concluded on 27th September 1958.

The countries invited are: Afghanistan; Brunei, North Borneo, Sarawak and Singapore Group; Burma, Cambodia, Ceylon, China, Indonesia, India, Iran, Japan, Korea, Laos, Malaya, Nepal, Pakistan, the Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam. India, which in the past few years has been one of the leading protagonist of community development, is acting as host country.

The purpose of the Seminar is three fold: firstly to give an opportunity of airing and sharing experiences in the field of fundamental education; secondly to extend knowledge in the production and use of visual aids and to open new avenues for development and finally to provide an opportunity for examining materials and equip-

ment available and of seeing films and films strips made for educational purposes in many countries in the world.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The seminar, which was inaugurated on 8th Sep. '58 made significant recommendations such as the following:

Organisation of national centres for training "educators" in the use of audio-visual aids.

A concise guide on the basic requirements for the setting up of audio-visual aids should be prepared.

An extensive use of specially selected feature films be made in community development programmes and that Government should help by providing liaison personnel and facilities (for production, travel and stay at sites) to producers of films using themes relevant to community development programmes.

W. Mr. Harold Loper, Director of UNESCO's Departof Education. ment sented the Director General at the opening ceremony. Other UNESCO personnel taking part are M. Andre Lestage from the Department Education, Mr. J.S. Bownagary and Mr. Honny de Jong from the Department of Mass Communication. Mr. de Jong will act as Director of the Seminar.

Discussions were opened on working papers compiled by the UNESCO Secretariat outlining and summarising experience

gained so far in fundamental education and community development. Participants have also been asked to report on progress in their countries and to provide films and exhibition material demonstrating methods being used. The major part of the time available, however, was devoted to review of visual aids, discussion of their potentialities, the evaluation of films and film strips and a study of methods of poster-making, flannelgraph presentation and other teaching equipment.

A new element, of particular interest to countries developing television organisations, will be the description of the setting up of Tele-clubs in France and Japan. UNESCO made a special study of the teleclubs in these countries and will present a film on the organisation of such club, the effect of group viewing and the educational results in rural communities.

Participants in the Seminar also had access to one of UNESCO's eight travelling reference libraries, a compact unit equipped with reference books, instructional volumes on the manufacture of visual aids, thirty films and film strips and other materials designed to help producers and field workers engaged in fundamental education projects.

Pointing out the immediate value of a seminar of this kind, Mr. de Jong said it served to bring together people who often had to work in extreme isolation, to establish contacts

deading to regional cooperation and to give new impetus to plans and expansion of community development projects.

Indian Children's Films:

MARY FIELD'S VIEWS

A press note says:

London, September 15. The decision of the newly constituted Executive Council of the Children's Film Society of India to affiliate a national film centre with the International Children's Film Centre in Brussels was warmly welcomed today by Miss Mary Field, Chairman of the International Centre.

"I am delighted", Miss Field said. "This is tremendously good news."

Miss Field, who is also Executive Officer of Britain's Children's Film Foundation, leaves tomorrow (Monday) for Brussels to attend the International Film Festival lasting 10 days during which the Indian Children's Film Society is showing some films.

Miss Field is a great admirer of Indian made children's films. "I am so glad they have decided to join us at the Brussels centre." she said, "because Indian children's films are so good. The photography, production, choice of subjects are all first class. The disappointment is that so far we have not been able to show any Indian children's films here because they need some modification appeal to Western children. I hope the move to join the international centre will bring the day nearer when we shall be able to show to Western children films made in India which delight Indian children so much."

Miss Field could not comment on the production programme for three feature and two shorts just decided by the Indian Society's Executive Council, because she did not know what age groups they were intended for.

"But I am very pleased to hear that features are being shortened to about 6,000 feet. This is very hopeful. Western children do not like films so as Indian children. lengthy Sixthousand feet is much more promising length. between 5,000 and 6,000 feet some children's films made here have done very well in India. So by some slight modification to the Indian productions they would be suitable for showing here and lose no popularity at home.

It will be recalled that the film 'JALDEEP' produced by the Children's Film Society won the first award at the international Film Festival in Venice last year for the age group 13 to 16 for "its charm and the exaltation of generous feelings". The length of the film was about 8,000 feet.

"Two other modifications which would increase their appeal to Western audiences would be in the way scripts are written and dialogue is handled. Our children like a story plain and straight forward which starts at the beginning and ends at the end. They don't want

too much dialogue. They want gaps so that they can talk about what they are seeing. I am looking forward with great interest to seeing the Indian films in Brussels this week and hope we shall soon be showing them in Britain and on the European Continent because it is important for the young people of all nations to get to know each other better. This is particularly true of the children of East and West"

Miss Mary Field came to India in 1956 and advised the Children's Film Society on the production and exhibition of children's films.

Indian Children's Films to be Shown in Bhutan:

A press note dated 20th September 1958 states:

Three Indian films produced by the Children's Film Society will be shown in Bhutan to coincide with the visit of the Prime Minister to these places.

Shrimati Indira Gandhi, who is accompanying the Prime Minister, was the Vice-President of the Children's Film Society when the films were made. The film 'JALDEEP' has in the background a lighthouse and was mostly produced at the sea-shore of Karwar. The Bhutan children who probably have never seen a sea are likely to be attracted by the film.

The film 'SCOUT CAMP', which was made in Darjeeling, is an adventure story of a few scouts who helped the police in catching a gang of dacoits. This film will also be of interest to

children in Bhutan since the manner of dresses and behaviour of Bhutanis and the people of Darjeeling have a close resemblance.

The third film 'GANGA KI LAHREN' depicts some outstanding events of Indian history that happened on the banks of the Ganges. Particularly the preachings of Lord Budha at Sarnath will be liked by the children in Bhutan who are mostly Buddhists.

Venice Film Festival:

PREMIER AWARD FOR JAPANESE PICTURE

Venice: Sept. 10: A Japanese film, "The Rickshaw Man", directed by Hiroshi Inagaki, was awarded "The Golden Lion of Saint Mark" for the best film at the International film Festival at Venice here.

The British actor, Alec Guinness, won the "best actor" award for his performance as Gully Jimson in "The Horse's Mouth" directed by Ronald Neame.

Sophia Loren, the Italian actress, won the best actress award for her portrayal of a widow in the "Black Orchid", an American film.

The Venice jury's special prize was shared by the French and Italian directors, Louis Malle and Francisco Hosi.

The "Saint George Prize" for 1958, a prize awarded by an Italian jury, went to Francisco Rosi's "La Sfida", starring Rossana Schiaffino A tautlydirected film about the Naples underworld.

The International film critics prize awarded by a jury of 18 critics from different countries went to "The Wolves' Lair" a Czechoslovakisan film about middle class provincial life at the turn of the century directed by Jiri Weiss.

The international jury praised the prize-winning Japanese film for its "notably simple style, poetic invention, integral performances and the purity of its dominant sentiment.
